Traineeships

We have had 16 students either complete, or on track to complete, school-based traineeships in Hospitality, Retail, Business and more. Pictured below are senior students who recently completed a Cert III Business traineeship through our partner, Australian Retail College. We also have 3 students signed up for school-based apprenticeships in Hairdressing, Automotive and Refrigeration respectively







The past couple of weeks we wrapped up our VET courses and students submitted their final pieces of assessment for the year. We held graduations and celebrations for our exiting Year 12 students in Construction, Automotive and Hospitality.

ASA

The Sports Academy students have been working hard this term. They have been to the gym, working with personal trainers to develop their form and strength during workouts. Training for the Arethusa football team has been going well, learning and developing their skills and teamwork. In English, students have viewed sports-themed movies and completed film reviews on these. In Digital Technology, students developed their skills in Scratch coding as well as programming and coding Spheros. It was such fun watching the students navigate these through mazes designed by their peers. In Mathematics, students practised a range of concepts including number, shape, probability and statistics.







Junior School

Students viewed and analysed the Shark Tale movie as part of film review for English. A small group chose an alternative movie - anime film - which was really interesting to see. For Digital Technology, students learned to code using Scratch, then consolidated this knowledge by coding small games, the robots to complete mazes, and short animations. In maths, students developed their growing understanding of probability and statistics, number and shape. In Mathematics we have been focussing on shape, finding missing angles and statistics. We took a more hands-on approach for identifying triangles where students made various triangles and identified them by angles, and sides.

In Project we explored different areas of STEM where students created solar ovens taking advantage of the hot days to make smores! Some were eaten before they got a chance to melt. We also made paper planes and built bridges out of triangles.

In HPE we looked at sportsmanship both good and bad, and practised good sportsmanship by participating in team sports such as flag tag, tee ball and variations of tag. We further developed skills utilised in various Olympic sports, such as throwing, aiming and hitting targets.

Scratch, a visual programming language, empowers students to craft their own interactive narratives, games, and animations. Through the process of designing projects on Scratch, students not only unleash their creativity but also cultivate skills in logical reasoning and collaborative teamwork. Our students showcased their ingenuity with a range of captivating games, featuring everything from animated snowmen to dancing turtles.

The latter part of the term we focused on finishing assessments for the final push for the end of the year. Students worked well and are commended for their efforts to complete their work. We wish our middle students a Merry Christmas and a happy new year.
